ADULT LEADER BACKPACK TRAINING

In order to provide Backpack Training for adult leaders planning long term hikes or participating in year 'round High Adventure programs, the LAAC High Adventure Team will conduct the 45th Council Backpack Training Seminar for registered adult scouters on the weekend of 19-21 Feb 2010 at the Cabrillo Scout Center in San Pedro.

This program is conducted in two parts. The first part on 19-21 February 2010 comprises a series of demonstrations, presentations, and discussions covering a variety of subjects including leadership, preparation and conditioning, equipment and gear, cooking and menu planning, first aid and safety, mountain travel and orientation, conservation, long term hike planning and the high adventure program awards and procedures. Emphasis is placed on encouraging adult leaders to transfer training to their junior leaders and assistants. The second part is the field trip. This requires outdoor experience and provides the practical application of the subjects covered.

LOOKING FOR SOMETHING NEW TO DO?

Come aboard the **S.S. Lane Victory** a 10,000 ton World War II "Victory" cargo ship, lovingly and meticulously restored by volunteers and operated by U.S. Merchant Marine Veterans of World War II. This national historic landmark is a living memorial to the seamen who lost their lives at sea. It includes a museum of ship memorabilia including whistles, flags and cannons; gift shop and library. One-hour guided tours of the bridge, crew's quarters, ham radio room and engine rooms are available, as are occasional all-day voyages recalling the adventures of its service in World War II, Korea and Viet Nam. Visitors can go from the bridge to the galley to the cargo holds. Not wheelchair-accessible; no sandals or high heels. Open for self-guided tours from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM daily. Donation: \$3.00 per adult, \$1.00 per child 15 and under. Group rates are available for tours. Two hours of free parking is available at the site. Berth 94, San Pedro, phone 310-519-9545.
