If you need help, ask the SPL or your adult Patrol Coordinator. Their role is to make you a successful leader. They will observe your leadership. Meet with them after each week's meeting to discuss your leadership and what you can do to be more effective. Also, at any time, if you just need some extra help, they are there for you.
